On May 14 & 15, COAR will host a meeting of repository networks to talk about services and technologies of networks around the world. Rather than relying on centralized (mainly commercial) services for supporting open science, open data and scholarly communication, we aim to develop and strengthen national and regional services that are managed locally and that reflect diverse needs and requirements of different countries.

Currently, there are significant differences in terms of service delivery and standards across repository networks. This meeting will contribute to the adoption of common functionalities and standards across networks and the adoption of enhanced services. In addition, the meeting will provide an opportunity to discuss next generation repository functionalities, as described in the recent [COAR Next Generation Repositories Report](#), and develop strategies for adopting these recommendations in various local contexts.

- Mapping of current network services and functionalities
- Best practices for building national and regional communities of practices
- Awareness and strategies for the adoption of next generation repository functionalities at the networks
- Priorities for interoperability across networks

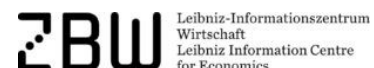
