

COAR Controlled Vocabularies Workshop Metadata Elements and Controlled Vocabularies for Repositories

The use of controlled vocabularies for bibliographic metadata "ensures that everyone is using the same word to mean the same thing". The adoption of controlled vocabularies is a way to enhance the interoperability across repositories and with other related systems such as harvesters, CRIS systems, data repositories and publishers.

This workshop will present the work to date of the COAR Controlled Vocabulary Editorial Board, overview on the importance of metadata and vocabularies to the extent of current guidelines, demonstrate how the vocabularies can be implemented into repositories in variety of networks, introduce principles for vocabulary implementations and linked data in next generation repositories, and discuss strategies for international alignment of metadata and vocabulary standards.
